Current Grade 7 Families (Class of 2026)

Mark your calendars now for the Class of 2026 Parent Meeting, which will be held on Sunday, September 7, 2025 at 6:00 pm. I will be sharing information related to the high school application process and what to expect during your child's 8th grade year. I learned this week from the Archdiocese that the HSPT (high school placement test) will be administered during the school day to current St. Stephen students on Wednesday, November 19, 2025. Additionally, please see the email communication from April 7 with the information regarding the summer HSPT Prep course - you can register HERE.

Spring MAP Testing Continues: April 9-10

Students in grades 2-8 will take the required spring MAP testing from 8:30-10:00 am on April 9 (math) and April 10 (language). We ask that students be on time at morning arrival on these days and please do your best to not schedule any doctor appointments. Your child should be sure to eat breakfast on these days as well. All MAP testing is done electronically on Chromebooks and results will be shared with families prior to the end of the school year. While there is nothing that your child can do to prepare, please encourage them to take this seriously and try their best. MAP measures growth and their scores will be compared to the scores they earned from the initial testing in the fall. The only change to the above schedule will be for the grade 7 language test. They will take that test only on April 11 as they will be on a field trip on April 10.

April 11: Mid-way point of trimester three. Interims will be released on April 16 as we head into Easter break.

April 17 -18 & April 21-25: Easter break with school closed for students and faculty

April 28: School resumes and Spring uniform begins - please see handbook for guidelines. If there is unseasonably and consistently warm weather, we will let families know if the Spring uniforms will begin earlier, but we do not anticipate that happening.

April 29: Pre-HSPT administered at St. Stephen to Class of 2026. The Archdiocese now requires that all grade 7 students take the Pre-HSPT during the school day. This test mimics the one that students take in November of their 8th grade year as part of the high school admissions process. There is no cost for this test to families. The results will be sent home with your child towards the end of the school year and can serve as a data point of areas where they are doing well on standardized tests and areas where improvement can be made. These scores are NOT shared with high schools. On April 29, all grade 7 students can wear their SSS PE

uniform and should bring two #2 pencils (no mechanical pencils permitted). There is nothing that your child needs to do to prepare other than to take the test seriously and to try their best. The test will last from 8:30 am until lunchtime. Teachers who have grade 7 students in the afternoon of April 29 will be keeping their classes very simple and relaxed.

May 2: Volunteer Appreciation Prayer Service at 8:30 am in the school gym, Spring Band Concert for families at 4:00 pm in gym.
