Dear Families of Rising Kindergarteners,

Welcome! I'm so excited to have your child join our Kindergarten class in the upcoming school year. Starting Kindergarten is a big and exciting milestone—for children and families alike. To help your child feel confident and prepared for this new adventure, I'd like to share some key areas you can work on together over the summer.

These skills don't require formal lessons—they can be practiced through simple, fun, everyday activities. The more comfortable your child feels with these basics, the more smoothly they'll transition into the school routine.



Focus Areas for Summer Readiness:

1. Independence Skills

Encouraging independence now will help your child feel more confident at school.

- Practice putting on and zipping coats or backpacks
- Opening lunch containers and snack bags independently
- Using the bathroom and washing hands without reminders
- Cleaning up after themselves (putting toys or materials away)

2. Social-Emotional Readiness


Kindergarten is a social environment where children learn and play together.

- Practice taking turns, sharing, and using kind words
- Talk about how to express feelings appropriately ("I feel sad because...")
- Encourage following 1-2 step directions
- Help your child get comfortable being away from parents for short periods

3. Early Academic Skills

We will build on these skills in Kindergarten, but early exposure can make a big difference.

- Name Recognition & Writing: Practice recognizing and writing first name (first letter capital, rest lowercase)
- Letter Recognition: Identify uppercase and lowercase letters
- Counting: Count aloud to at least 20, recognize numbers 0–10
- Colors & Shapes: Identify basic shapes (circle, square, triangle, etc.) and colors
- Read Together Daily: Point out the cover, title, and talk about what's happening in the story



4. Fine Motor Skills

Strong fingers make confident writers!

- Use crayons, markers, and pencils to draw and color
- Cut simple shapes with child-safe scissors
- Build with blocks, play with playdough, and do simple crafts



Helpful Tips:

- Keep a consistent bedtime and morning routine
- Limit screen time and encourage imaginative play
- Visit the library or explore books together regularly

Kindergarten is a year of tremendous growth, and your support at home will set your child up for success. Most importantly, make learning fun—sing songs, play games, and enjoy this special time before school begins!


